OUTLINE OF PROJECTS

Project 1: **Becoming a digital communicator –** working with a group of committed, like-minded pupils to set up a new digital platform for the school, so that it can share with a wider audience its work and achievements.

Project 2: **Becoming a role model for others –** exploring what makes someone a genuine role model for others; working together with a committed group of pupils to learn how to become role models for others in the school and in society more widely.

Project 3: **Becoming a problem-solver** – learning from the experience and writing of people outside the school strategies and ways of working for solving real problems at school and in life; testing out some of those ideas in practice.

Project 4: **Becoming a virtual exhibition curator** – using the latest technology to set up a virtual exhibition about the school's 310 year history, drawing on published materials and available photographs; creating your own exhibition space, accessible with 3D headsets.
