Dear Year 7 Parents and Carers

Year 7 - Inappropriate use of Social Media Platforms

We have become increasingly aware that a number of Year 7 pupils are putting other pupils at risk through their poor choices on social media. Recent phone checks have shown that a number of pupils have taken images or videos of their peers without consent, some of which have been taken on the school site and also travelling to and from school. There have also been a small number of cases of cyberbullying, which we all know can have a very negative impact on young people. This type of use of social media is not appropriate and cannot be something which is accepted or normalised.

Please note that 'phone checks' are only carried out if there is a concern about inappropriate or unsafe use of social media. Our recent 'phone checks' confirmed that some Year 7 pupils have photo images and video footage of their peers, which have been taken without consent and have been shared. Some pupils have also been searching inappropriate material with some of the account names being highly inappropriate. We have also become aware that pupils are being added to large WhatsApp groups where members are encouraged to add all of their contracts. Participation in these groups is highly unsafe behaviour, as children are unaware of the group participants and the motives behind the group. Today, pastoral staff have made pupils aware of how to change their account settings to keep themselves from being added to these groups. We have also reinforced the message that they are responsible for the content on their phones, even if they did not create or send the content.

Parents and carers can support the safe use of social media in a healthy and positive way by agreeing a day and time with their child each week, to go through their use of social media.

From the images that have been seen and the choice of account names on TiKToK, I think that not enough parents and carers are currently monitoring their child's use of social media. This is not always an easy task, but it is an important responsibility for parents and carers, if we are to help pupils to learn to communicate in a kind, thoughtful and healthy way. If you are aware of any misuse of social media, please report it to your child's Form tutor, Mr Bryars, Head of Year or myself, immediately. Often the impact of misuse is played out in schools and early communication helps to prevent situations worsening or having a more significant negative impact on our community.

We will continue to communicate with our community about safe use of mobile phones and social media and treat any misuse very seriously.
