

GCSE Results 2026

We would like to take this opportunity to congratulate our Year 11 pupils on the results they achieved in their GCSE examinations this year. Results Day was a joyful and important occasion for our school community, and we were delighted to celebrate with pupils as they collected their results and prepared for the next stage of their education, training or employment.

This year, our pupils achieved a number of strong individual and subject outcomes, reflecting their hard work, resilience and commitment throughout Year 11. Across the comparable cohort, the school achieved an Attainment 8 score of 4.6 and a Progress 8 score of -0.03 . In English and mathematics, 61% achieved grade 4 or above and 38% achieved grade 5 or above. These outcomes represent substantial improvement from the January mock examinations, including increases of 19 percentage points at Grade 4 or above and 20 percentage points at Grade 5 or above in English and Mathematics.

We would like to offer particular congratulations to our highest-achieving pupils. Edward and Eliana each achieved an outstanding Attainment 8 score of 8.5, while Miriam achieved an excellent 8.2. Further congratulations go to Ifeolu and Jamel, who each achieved 7.8, as well as Nathaniel and Daniel, who each achieved 7.6. These results are a testament to their dedication, perseverance and academic ambition.

We also celebrate pupils whose final results showed exceptional progress. Leo achieved the strongest Progress 8 outcome in the cohort, with Edward, Shonelle, Jamel and Isaiah also achieving particularly strong progress across their GCSE subjects. Their achievements demonstrate the difference that sustained effort, positive learning habits and determination can make.

At subject level, pupils achieved particularly positive progress in Double Science, Latin, History and the separate Sciences. We were also pleased to see strong improvement from the January mock examinations across many subjects, led by Mathematics, Double Science, History and Religious Studies.

These outcomes are a testament not only to the efforts of our pupils, but also to the support provided by staff, parents and carers throughout their studies. We are grateful to everyone who encouraged, taught and supported this cohort during their time at Archbishop Tenison's.

As a school community, we wish all of our Year 11 pupils every success as they move on to Sixth Form, College, apprenticeships and other exciting next steps. We are confident that they will continue to embody the values of Archbishop Tenison's and make a positive contribution to the communities and institutions they join.
