



Archbishop Tenison's Church of England High School, Croydon A-Level Exam Results – Summer 2021

We want to take this opportunity fully to congratulate our Year 13 students on the excellent results they have achieved this year. Tuesday, 10th August, was a joyful and exciting day for our whole school community, when we were able to celebrate with students as they collected their results and heard of their considerable success in reaching their chosen destinations in Higher Education, in an apprenticeship or, in some cases, giving them the grades they need for a future application during a gap year. Given the challenges this year group has faced during their Sixth Form courses, this represents a great triumph over adversity. As a school, we are impressed by the determination and character they have shown.

One of the challenges for all of us was not having external exams this year. As you will be aware, the grades this summer were based on Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs), submitted to the exam boards as a holistic assessment of students' performance in a subject, following a rigorous process of assessment, moderation and quality assurance. After external quality assurance checks had been completed, these grades were approved by the relevant exam board. Having seen this process carefully through each stage, we know how robust and thorough it has had to be: the grades which have resulted from the careful and rigorous internal assessment are strong and well evidenced.

At Archbishop Tenison's 9.9% of this year's grades at A Level were A*, 30% A* or A, and 62.4% A*, A or B. Well done to all those involved in achieving this across our many different Sixth Form subjects.

Subjects which achieved the highest percentages at A*-A were: Further Mathematics (66.7%), Sociology (54.5%), Film Studies (50%), French (50%), Geography (50%) and Music (50%). We also saw success across several subjects at A*-B: Classical Civilisation (100%), Drama (100%), Further Mathematics (100%), Music (100%), Physical Education (80%), Psychology (81%) and Sociology (82%). In addition, Computer Science, Film Studies, French, Physical Education, Religious Studies and Sociology all achieved 100% of their grades at A* - C. Once again there was a superb performance by students in the Extended Project: 10 students gained an A*, 11 students an A, and 3 students a B.

We also want to note some outstanding individual achievements by students whose hard work and commitment achieved excellent grades across all three, or in some cases, four subjects. Particular congratulations are due to:
