We would like to take this opportunity to congratulate our Year 13 students on the excellent results they have achieved this year. Results Day was a joyful and exciting occasion for our whole school community, and we were delighted to celebrate with students as they collected their results and secured their chosen destinations in Higher Education, apprenticeships and other exciting next steps.

This year we are pleased to report many strong individual and subject outcomes, reflecting the hard work, resilience and commitment shown by our students throughout their time in the Sixth Form.
