

Routines: Arrival to lessons

- Ensure that you are punctual for the start of each lesson.
- Three minute bell continues from last term.
- After the 3-minute bell, any pupil who is late will be recorded, along with the number of minutes late also recorded.
- All latecomers will automatically receive a same-day 30-minute detention, including late to school in the morning.
- Any student recorded late on 3 or more occasions, will receive a 60minute detention.
- Pupils should not go to the toilet or anywhere else between lessons as this will make them late.



Routines: Equipment

- We expect all our students to be fully equipped and ready for learning everyday. It is NOT acceptable for a child to arrive at any lesson without their necessary equipment.
- ALL Pupils must also have their <u>Lunch Fobs</u> as part of their equipment.
- Equipment will be checked regularly by Tu
- The Sixth Form run an Equipment Shop of pencil cases with their essential items.

Pencil case- with the following items

- Ruler This must be made of plastic or wood
- Eraser
- Sharpener
- Highlighter pen (x 2 colours)
- 3 pens (blue/black) one to use, one to lose, one to lend
- Pencil (x 2)
- Green pen
- Reading book
- Exercise book
- Calculator
- Lunch fob



Routines: Uniform & Jewellery

- The Uniform Policy is on the school website but as you are aware from the letter sent home before the summer break, this year there are some slight amendments:
- 1. Head wear (Includes, but not limited to Hair bonnets, Du-rags, bandanas and non-religious head scarves) is not permitted in the building.
- 2. All skirts must now not be above the knee.
- 3. It is also vital that **ALL** trousers must **now** be worn at the **waist only**.
- 4. Only 1 small stud allowed in each ear. No other jewellery permitted.



Routines: Uniform

What happens when uniform does not follow the school policy?

- 1. If your child fails to follow the school's policy on uniform, we will contact you, on the day in the morning to send your child home to give them the chance to correct this.
- 2. If we are not able to make successful contact with you, your child will then spend a day in the seclusion room. This decision is made as your child will not have represented themselves or the school in a professional manner, which means they will need to be out of circulation.
- If your child repeatedly fails to adhere to the school policy, they will also be issued with a detention on the day.
- Note: We will take on-board any personal circumstances that causes your child, to be unable to wear their school uniform in
 its entirety, this will be decided on a case-by-case basis. When this is the case, an email will be sent to staff so that they are
 aware that your Son / Daughter has been given permission to wear a non-uniform item.




